Glossary

RGB (Red, Green, Blue) color mode is for anything that is computer-based design. This includes websites, apps, banner ad and any other design created for electronic use.

CMYK (Cyan, Magenta, Yellow, Black) color mode is used for print design. This includes logos, business cards, stationary, illustration, packaging and any other designs used for print.

JPEG/JPG is a picture with background.

PNG is a picture with transparent background.

Pixels, abbreviated as "px", are also a unit of measurement commonly used in graphic and web design, equivalent to roughly $\frac{1}{96}$ **inch** (0.26 mm). This measurement is used to make sure a given element will display as the same size no matter what screen resolution views it.

110x110 px is the smallest display size in this package. Shall not be scaled up.

1500 x 1000 px the medium display size in this package. Can be scaled down to preferred size, but not up.

2500 x 1500 px is the largest display size in this package. Ideal for printing where the logo shall be displayed wide.
